Strategy: Segmentation Strategy

l-igh-t


Split the words up into sounds, helping you to remember how the word is put together.

Strategy: Quick Write



Write as many words as you can in the time given, e.g. In 2 minutes, write as many words as possible with the /igh/ tri-graph.

Strategy: Draw to show the shape



Draw a shape around the word to remember the ascenders and descenders. Now write the word to see if you have the same shape.

Strategy: Draw a picture around the word



Draw a picture around the word to help you give meaning to the word.

You can't use this every time but it is good for those more tricky words to make them memorable.

Strategy: Words without vowels.

Choose the vowels to complete the word so that it makes sense.

Read it back to yourself to make sure you have got it right.

Strategy: Pyramid Words

You can reverse this to make a rhombus shape.


Strategy: Rainbow Writing
