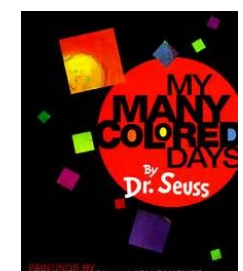
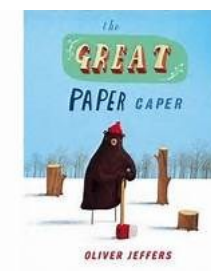
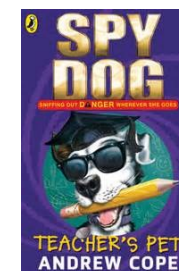
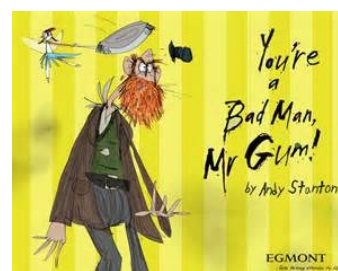
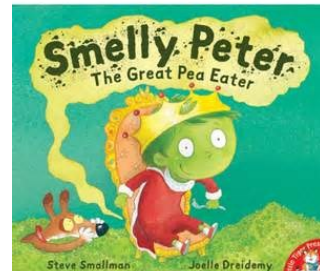
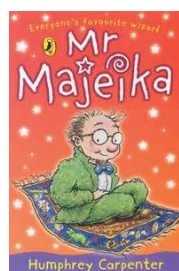
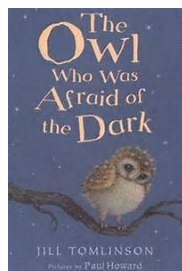
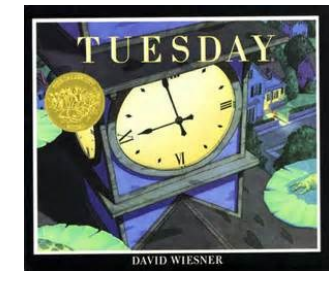
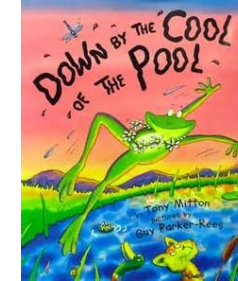
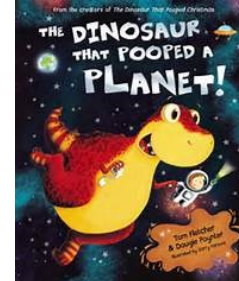
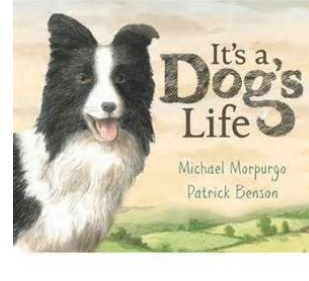
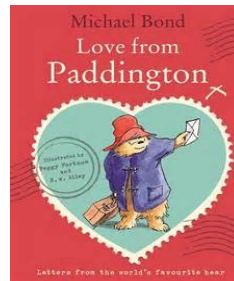
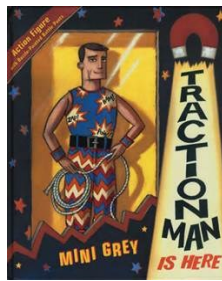
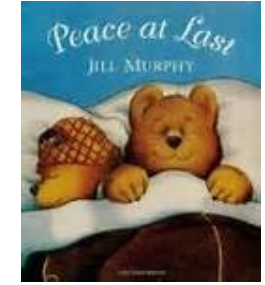
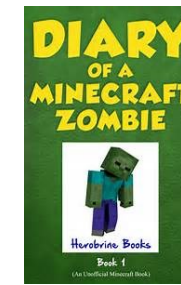
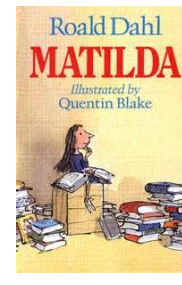
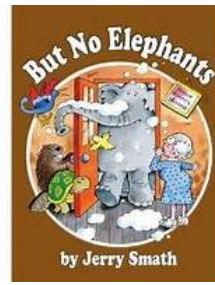
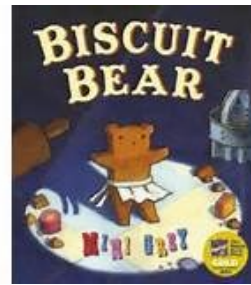
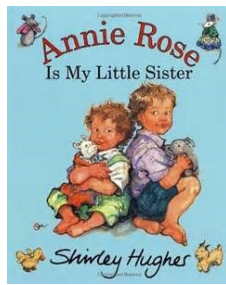
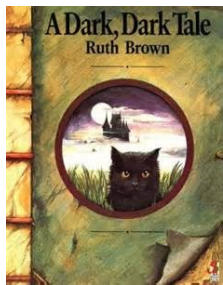


Year Two Recommended Reading
