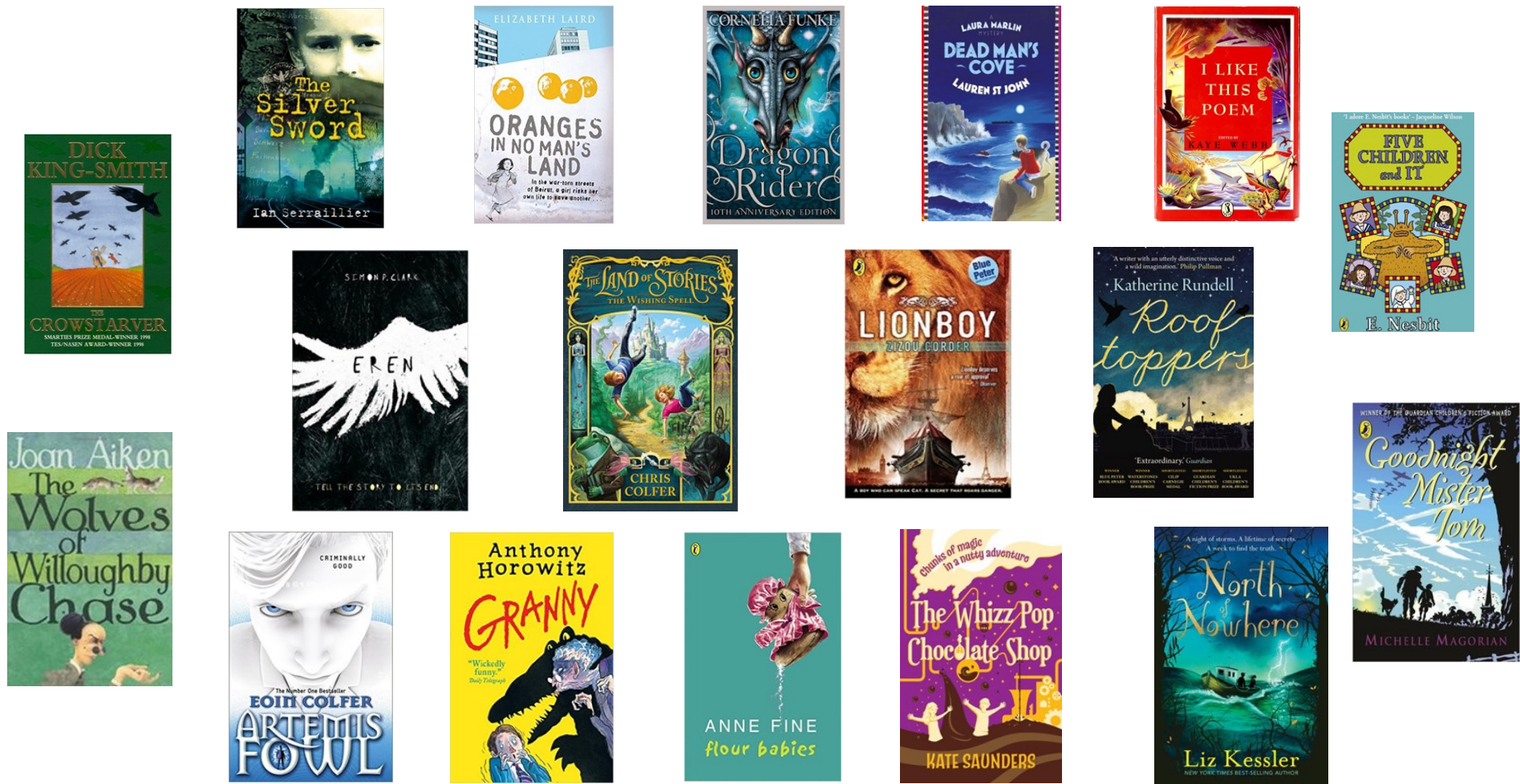


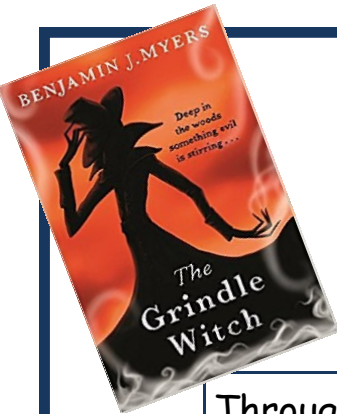
Year Six Recommended Reading
