Forming Numbers - The Rules

- When a symbol appears **after a larger** (or equal) symbol it is **added**

- Example: VI = V + I = 5 + 1 = 6
- Example: LXX = L + X + X = 50 + 10 + 10 = 70

- But if the symbol appears **before a larger** symbol it is **subtracted**

- Example: IV = V - I = 5 - 1 = 4
- Example: IX = X - I = 10 - 1 = 9
