# Writing

This week our writing will be based on the book 'The Bog Baby' by Jeanne Willis.

Monday – Look at the front cover of the book. Make a prediction about what might happen in the book? Who will be in the story? What will it be about? Where will it be set?

Tuesday – Talk to an adult about what a question is. When do we use them? How are they are different to a normal sentence? What punctuation should we use? Look at the front cover again, If you met the Bog Baby, what would you want to know about him? Write some questions that you would ask him.

Wednesday – Read the story of the Bog Baby (PowerPoint on Microsoft Teams). Can you tell an adult what has happened in the story in your own words?

Thursday – Discuss with an adult – If you had a bog baby what would it look like? Where would it live? What would it eat? Create and label your own bog baby.

# Friday – Write some sentences to describe your Bog Baby. Think about what he looks like, what he might smell like.

## Other Subjects


Science / computing – Research amphibians. What is special about them? Can you draw and describe a few.
