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Writing

Our writing this week will focus on Edgar the Dragon.

Monday - Character Description – Watch the videolink https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JPQsip61_o0

Take a really good look at Edgar the dragon...can you describe him? Use as many adjectives (describing words) as you can. Think carefully about what he looks like. e.g. Edgar has sharp teeth.

Tuesday – Setting – Look at the setting pictures. Write three sentences about where Edgar and Ava live.

Wednesday – Edgar is sorry! – Watch the video again. Think about all of the things Edgar did that made the villagers upset with him! Talk about these with someone in your house. Why do you think Edgar has done some of the naughty things? Is he a bad dragon? Or just very excited to join in? Write a letter from Edgar to Ava or the villagers explaining how sorry he is.

Thursday – The beginning, middle and End - What is Edgar's story? Can you write about each part of the story? Draw pictures and colour them in to go with your sentences.

Some things to help - The beginning of the story...Where is Edgar? Who is he with? What does he want to do with the other children?

Middle – Ice skating, Christmas tree, what does he do when he realises everyone is sad with him? End – What does Ava do? Why does everyone clap at the end?

Friday – A Christmas Card for Edgar – Can you make a Christmas card for Edgar with a kind Christmas message inside?
