the little knight.

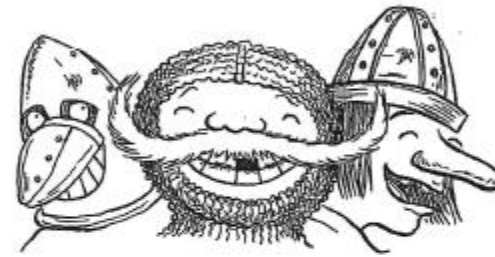
"Short trip, is it?" grinned Sir
