Sports Premium Analysis Plan 2020-21



At Victoria Dock Primary School, we believe that PE and sport plays a crucial role within each child's education and can change young people's lives for the better.

We have welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this resource to develop high quality PE lessons, provide training and support for staff and to provide greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people.

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum until 2020 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Fortunately, the Government have announced that the PE and Sport Premium has been secured for the next academic year. This means that our school can continue to invest in additional and sustainable improvements to improve the quality of the PE, physical activity and sport that we offer. The government have also announced that we are able to rollover any underspend from the last academic year.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

The total amount of grant received by Victoria Dock Primary School for the 2020/21 year is £18,612

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
 paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
 - providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
 - running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
 - buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

At Victoria Dock Primary School, the impact of the Sports Premium has had a significant effect on increasing the pupils' progress and outcomes. In addition, it has provided the opportunity for enhanced extra curriculum activities, allowing children to try out additional activities such as table tennis, gymnastics and judo.

Funding

Sports Premium Plan 2020-2021

In 2020-2021 the school will receive £18,612 as its Sports Premium Grant.

At Victoria Dock Primary School, we have split up the funding by the three key areas for consideration;

- Physical Education
- Healthy, Active Lifestyles
 - Competitive sport
